<u>Journey In Faith (RCIA) Group – Family of Parishes:</u> Our Journey In Faith (RCIA) group – meeting at St Teresa's Penwortham - is now in 'full swing' having recently met for the second time. The purpose of the group is to accompany on their journey in faith a group of 'Enquirers' – people who are considering becoming Catholics – who are drawn from all of the churches in our 'family of parishes'.

Last week offered an introduction and explanation of the purpose of the course followed by a tour of St Teresa's church concluding with a short time of prayer in the sanctuary with the Easter Candle. At the request of the Archbishop, Fr Simon Henry, long-time parish priest at St Catherine's, Farington, has also taken on responsibility for St Mary's parish in Euxton. It was then proposed that the two parishes "merge" to form one parish with two churches. Having consulted with parishioners of both parishes (and those of St Mary's Leyland, as they will be affected by some boundary changes as well) it was agreed to instigate this process. At a meeting of the Council of Priests (an advisory body to the Archbishop) this was unanimously recommended. So the process of uniting the two parishes can now go forward in Canon Law. When it happens, there will be some form of celebration to mark the occasion.

Fr Simon writes: It has been a challenging time for the two parishes, particularly for St Catherine's, where Mass times have been drastically changed. Of course, many communities in the Archdiocese have undergone a similar process and there will be more to come, no doubt. However, there are positives to be drawn out of change that seems forced upon us by circumstances but in fact, may bear fruit in the longer term. My own experience at St Catherine's over 16 years has been a very happy one with a small but vibrant and committed community. That does not come to an end, rather there is now an opportunity to extend those same qualities and share them more widely. The same applies for the gifts evident among the community at St Mary's in Euxton. Already one seemingly negative - fewer Masses - is turning out to have positive aspects, for the three Masses between the two churches are now much fuller, which of itself, raises the spirit and feels empowering - boosting confidence that we are not a remnant but a large and thriving family.

The welcome of parishioners into one another's communities has also been a joyful thing, reflecting a truly Christian spirit. I take this opportunity to thank parishioners from both churches and to ask for your prayers for a continuing outpouring of God's Holy Spirit as we work to make God's presence known so that all may come to salvation in His Church.
