<u>Continuing our Synodal Journey - Mission Development:</u> "We are not just responsible for the Church today. Rather, we have a fundamental responsibility to hand a healthy and sustainable Church on to the next generation"

This is the opening line of the document that will be at the centre of much discussion in the next phase of our synodal journey as an Archdiocese. This process will enable us all to be engaged in planning and mission as we continue to move forward as the Archdiocese of Liverpool. Whilst affirming and supporting the great work that is currently taking place, we are called to explore new ways of working and being as we look with hope to the future. As we know, the resources we have, including the number of priests, deacons and lay volunteers are declining, therefore the number of buildings we have cannot be sustained across the Archdiocese. It is interesting to note that in **1960** Mass attendance was **260,000** and in **2023** was under **27,000**. In **1960** there were over **500** priests and there now just **100**. The number of churches has hardly changed, being around **200**. Later this month, the priests of the Archdiocese will meet to learn more of the implications of this strategy which will also be shared with Deanery Synodal Councils in readiness for discussion at a local level.
